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Language Competition for the Undergraduates of the Faculty of Management

General Guidelines

We recommend all entrants read the rules carefully.

1. The competition is open to all 200 and 300 level undergraduates of the Faculty of Management, University of Peradeniya.
2. The closing date of the competition is 10th February 2021.
3. All entries will be considered anonymously by a panel of judges.
4. Entries must not have been published, self-published, published on a website or made public on social media, broadcast or featured among the winners in another competition.
5. Any plagiarized work will be disqualified along with any other work submitted by the entrant.
6. Prizewinners will be notified by the beginning of the third week of February 2021 and invited to an awards ceremony organized virtually. All winners will be expected to provide a biography along with a photograph.

Poetry Competition

1. Poems should be composed in English.
2. One participant can submit maximum 03 entries and all entries will be considered anonymously by the panel of judges.
3. The poet's name must not appear on the poem itself.
4. Poems must be typed, double-spaced, on single-sided sheets and in a readable, 12 point Times New Roman font.
5. All poems must have a title and **must not exceed 40 lines in length** (excluding title). Entries can be on any subject.
6. Poems must be the entrant's original work.

Short Story Competition

1. Short stories must not exceed 3000 words.
2. Stories must be written in English.
3. Stories must be typed, double-spaced, on single-sided sheets and in a readable, 12 point Times New Roman font.
4. Stories must not have been published, self-published, published on a website, broadcast or featured amongst the winners in another competition.
5. Each page must be numbered.
6. The title of the story must appear at the top of each page.
7. Nothing must appear on any page which would reveal the author's identity.

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
